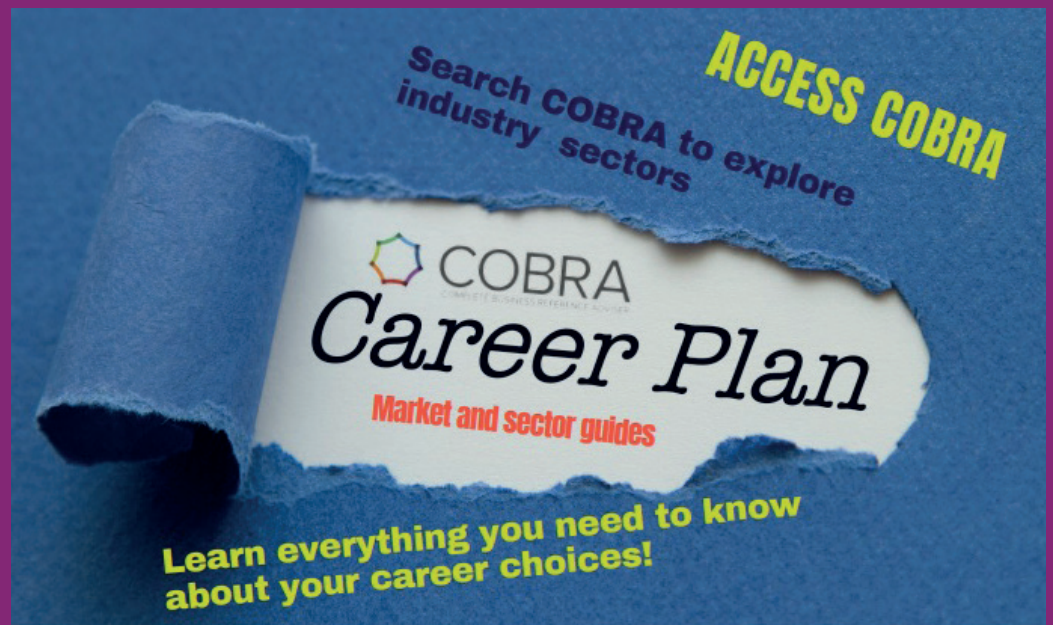

Young People's Support Service (YPSS)

Provides a free impartial careers information, advice, guidance and support service to targeted students in year 11 across all academies in North East Lincolnshire, including independent schools and alternative provision. These services are provided by Level 6 qualified Careers Advisers, who also work closely with our Lincs2 Prospectus Development Co-Ordinator and YPSS NEET Practitioners to support smooth transitions into post 16 pathways.

In addition to the free targeted services outlined above, YPSS also offer additional purchased service options such as wider careers information, advice and guidance services and destination tracking reports for previous leave years, in order to assist academies with meeting responsibilities covered in the Careers Strategy and associated Gatsby Benchmarks.

The service has also recently retained the Department for Education owned Matrix Standard for a further 3 years, which ensures the high-quality delivery of information, advice and guidance services to young people.
